Primary Elections and Primary Run-Off Elections (if necessary) are nomination elections for the Democratic and Republican parties.

Cross Over Voting Rules, effective August 1, 2017. Pursuant to **Act #2017-340, Section 2(a)**, if an elector votes in a primary election, he or she may vote in a subsequent primary run-off election *only* if he or she voted in the primary election of the *same political party* for which the run-off election is being held. For those persons who did not vote in a primary election, they may choose either party's ballot in a primary run-off election.

Offices having no opposition in the Primary Election will not appear on the ballot.
